Safety Information

Unpacking / Pre-Assembly

- Carefully remove the straps and cardboard packing from around the cart.
- 2. Read the IMPORTANT instructions attached to the plastic wrap on the top of the cart, before removing the plastic wrap. These instructions are to be used together with the instructions attached to the plastic wrap as applicable.
- 3. Using the key (provided) unlock the cart, then slide the upper covers open.
- Release the slide locks (Figure 1) and extend each cover to allow clearance for the removal of the keyboard and mouse trays.

Release slide locks to extend top covers



5. Remove the packing foam (if equipped), then the keyboard and mouse trays (Figure 2).



6. Position the cart drawer lock lever to the unlocked position (Figure 3). (Unlocks all drawers)

Cart Drawer Lock Lever (inside top tray area at rear)



Note: To open individual drawers, slide the drawer lock (located under the handle pull) to the left, then pull the drawer open.

Note: Ensure the upper tray is lying flat on the top surface of the cart.

- 7. Reinstall the keyboard and mouse trays.
- 8. Fully close the top covers, re-engaging the slide locks.
- 9. Remove the cardboard ramp from the top drawer.

 NOTICE: Ensure the top covers and all drawers are fully closed BEFORE rolling the cart off the pallet.
- 10. Facing the front of the cart, place the ramp on the right side of the pallet (Figure 4).
- 11. Remove the wheel chock boards from the pallet (Figure 4).

Position ramp and remove wheel chock boards from pallet



Crush Hazard

- Avoid serious personal injury, do not stand in front of the cart while it is rolling off the pallet.
- 12. Unlock the caster locks and then carefully PUSH the cart off the pallet (Figure 4).

Assembly

Important Assembly Information

- Do not overtighten threaded fasteners.
- To avoid damage, handle all components with care.
- Protect cart and component surfaces during assembly to avoid scratching or marring the finish.

Cart Handle Installation

Install the handle to either side of the cart using the four screws and lockwashers provided (Figure 5).

Cart Handle Installed



Monitor Installation

1. Install the monitor bracket to rear of the cart using four socket head cap screws and flat washers (Figure 6).

Monitor Bracket Installed



- 2. 1/4-20 x 1/2 in. Socket Head Cap Screws (4)
- 3. 1/4-20 in. Flat Washers (4)
- 2. Install the monitor to the monitor bracket using four M4 x 10 pan head screws and M4 flat washers (Figure 7).

NOTICE: The assistance of a helper is recommended to help support the monitor during installation. The monitor packing foam can also be used as support during installation.

Note: M8 pan head screws are included as optional equipment for mounting a monitor other than the one supplied.

Monitor Installed



Adjust the monitor angle (if needed) by loosening the two lower monitor bracket thumb screws (Figure 8), tilt the monitor up/down as needed, then tighten the screws.

Adjusting Monitor Angle



3. The monitor harness is shipped in the top tray area. Install and connect the harness as shown in the following images. Use cable ties on the corrugated tubing sections only.

Harness Installation




Figure 9 (Typical)

Harness Installation - Lower Cable Tie



Harness Connections - Inside (Upper Tray Area)



- 1. USB-C Hub
- 2. USB-C Hub Output to Diagnostic Tool (USB-C power input)
- 3. Monitor HDMI Cable to USB-C Hub
- 4. Monitor USB Cable to USB-C Hub
- 5. Power Supply to USB-C Hub
- 6. Power Supply Input from Power Strip

- Connect the AC power strip (on the back of the unit) to a grounded AC 120V/60Hz power supply outlet, then turn the AC power strip on.

Diagnostic Tool Setup

- 1. Install the battery pack into the diagnostic tool and secure it by sliding both locking tabs inward.
- Remove the keyboard and mouse from their packaging. Note: The following keyboard and mouse setup instructions are provided as quick installation reference only. Refer to the installation instructions provided with the keyboard and mouse for detailed instructions.
- 3. Remove the battery insulator strips from both the mouse and keyboard, then turn them on.
- 4. Insert the wireless keyboard/mouse USB transmitter into the USB-C hub (Figure 12).

Keyboard / Mouse USB Transmitter Installed



- 5. Place the diagnostic tool on the stand and connect the USB-C cable from the USB-C hub to the tool as shown (Figure 13).
- 6. Place the keyboard on the long shelf and the mouse on the short shelf in the upper tray area (Figure 13).



Upper Tray Component Location Reference












